Offshore, keep an eye out for majestic humpback whales as they make their epic journey north along the coast and back again with their calves each year. Closer to home, let the kids run free! Splash, swim and surf at one of the many famous beaches that make up the 57km strip of glorious coastline, or spend a day paddling in the calm waters of one of the sheltered creeks.

PLAY **GET OUT THERE**

Unleash your inner child in Australia's favourite playground! Dizzying rides, super-cute wildlife, watersports at all speeds – the fun just keeps on coming.

Thrills & spills

OXENFORD

With some of the most extreme waterslides in Australia, this waterpark is geared up for adrenalin. For thrills, head to the Tornado, the Super 8 Agua Racer and the Agualoop - a slide that releases swimmers through a trapdoor into a vertical free-fall. For younger visitors there's Wet'n'Wild Junior, a huge zone for little adventurers with mini versions of the big water slides. Had enough action for aday? Head to Calypso Beach, plonk onto a pool floatie and drift on the current through the calming tropical gardens. wetnwild.com.au

DREAMWORLD & WHITEWATER WORLD O COOMERA

With a whopping 40 rides in total, there's a whole heap of fun to be had here, and to make it easy to navigate, it's divided up into different themed 'lands'. Rides such as the Rip, the Wedgie and Pipeline Plunge at WhiteWater World deliver some serious splash. Don't miss Fully 6, with enough twists, turns and drops to get anyone's adrenaline working overtime. Calmer personalities will find fun at Wiggle Bay. dreamworld.com.au

WARNER BROS. MOVIE WORLD OXENFORD

Movie World offers a day of adventure enhanced by the glitz and glamour of your favourite Hollywood stars - Looney Tunes favourites such as Bugs Bunny and Scooby Doo, plus the superheroes (and supervillains) of the DC Comics. Young thrill seekers will love the Road Runner Rollercoaster and Yosemite Sam Railroad. while older adrenaline junkies can head for the DC Rivals Hypercoaster, the Southern Hemisphere's tallest, longest and fastest rollercoaster. O MAIN BEACH

Kids will love a scary (but safe!) encounter with sharks in the world's largest manmade lagoon, or dancing with the dolphins at Affinity Stadium. Need more of a thrill? Twist, turn and spin on the Vortex, the latest high-speed adventure in New Atlantis. For younger adventurers, Nickelodeon Land features kid-sized rides and a mini rollercoaster, plus favourite characters including Dora the Explorer, and the pups from Paw Patrol. seaworld.com.au







CURRUMBIN WILDLIFE SANCTUARY O CURRUMBIN

Do you know what a capybara is? Get ready to meet your new favourite animal! This super cute, semi-aquatic rodent stars at Currumbin Wildlife Sanctuary alongside a huge range of native Australian animals and birds. And it's not just about looking - there's a wishlist of animal experiences, including lorikeet feeding, koala photos and dingo walking, plus one of the busiest wildlife hospitals in the world. currumbinsanctuarv.com.au

O DEPART FROM SURFERS PARADISE It has to be one of the animal kingdom's most breathtaking spectacles. Each year, about 30,000 migrating humpback whales pass close to the Gold Coast's shores, travelling from Antarctica to the warmer waters of north Queensland, and back again. This ancient route is known as the Humpback Highway, and between June and November you can take a boat trip out to see whales frolicking in the ocean. whalesinparadise.com.au

DAVID FLEAY WILDLIFE PARK

Ø BURLEIGH HEADS

Set in the heart of Kombumerri country at Burleigh Heads, David Fleay Wildlife Park shows off the tranguil surrounds of natural habitat, from rainforest to bush. It is home to some of Queensland's most threatened species, such as bilbies, platypus and the bridled nailtail wallaby, once thought to be extinct. Don't miss the Fleays in Flight show, where raptors, owls and pelicans wow with their wing spans and speed. fleayswildlife.com.au

O NORTH TAMBORINE

Glow worms need a moist habitat to survive, and the sub-tropical rainforest of the hinterland makes a great home. These curious critters can be seen after dark at the Natural Bridge, covering the ceiling of the cave. If you have small children, you might prefer to visit the purpose-built Glow Worm Caves in Mount Tamborine during the day. On a guided tour, kids will love finding out what these mystical little creatures get up to. glowwormcavetamborinemountain.com.au

Tallebudgera 'Talle' Creek is a great place to cool off on a hot day. You can swim anywhere along the creek, but the most popular spots with local families are the patrolled south side - it has a coffee window offering tasty treats - and Echo Beach on the north side, where the water is clear and there are plenty of shallow spots for splashing about. It's a tranquil spot to have a picnic with friends while toddlers nap in the shade of the pandanus palms.

O BURLEIGH HEADS

If your holidays are all about unwinding, an outdoor yoga class is just what you need to connect with nature, stretch it out and relax. Take a class at Koala Park on the north side of Tallebudgera Creek, and bring your swimmers for a dip in the beautiful water afterwards. Water babies will love paddleboard yoga, where you can let the ocean lap over you and your board while you lie in savasana, and your worries drift away. purealohayoga.co

O DEPART FROM SURFERS PARADISE

Sightseeing while sitting down? Yes please. On a river cruise from Surfers Paradise, you can sit back and enjoy magnificent views as you pass the homes of the rich and famous

while sipping on an ice-cold juice or beer. Cruise the Nerang River past Chevron Island, Cronin Island and Paradise Waters, out to the Broadwater and beyond. Look out for the pod of dolphins that call the river home. surfersparadiserivercruises.com.au

O HOPE ISLAND OR MERMAID BEACH For golfers, the Gold Coast offers a wealth of choice, with more than 35 courses Coast-wide. The one with (arguably) the most stunning backdrop can be found on the water at Hope Island, near Paradise Point. Book a late tee time and you'll play with the oh-wow sun setting over the water. For family fun, Putt Putt at Mermaid Beach is a mini-golf marvel, with three themed 18-hole courses, video games arcade and a barbecue zone. linkshopeisland.com.au; puttputtgolf.com.au

© SURFERS PARADISE AND BEYOND

With more than 50km of beautiful sandy beaches, visitors come to swim, surf, play volleyball, build sandcastles and simply relax. Iconic status goes to Surfers Paradise, with 3km of postcard-perfect golden sand that has been attracting the lion's share of attention for more than 100 years. Even with an average of 20,000 visitors a day, it's still one of Australia's most pristine beaches.





O SPRINGBROOK NATIONAL PARK One of the most stunning sights – in a park

filled with stunning sights - is Natural Bridge, an arched cave with a sparkling waterfall that tumbles through its ancient basalt rock ceiling. You can do a self-guided walk on a marked circuit, or book a half-day tour of this pristine subtropical rainforest, which includes a visit to the area's other famous waterfalls: Purling Brook Falls and Rainbow Falls. Take in the panoramic views from Best Of All Lookout, and marvel at the sheer cliffs of Numinbah Valley. sc4wd.com.au

Ø BURLEIGH HEADS Get a different perspective of the beautiful Burleigh Headland on the Rainforest track from Tallebudgera Creek to Burleigh Point. A guided walk around Jellurgal also known as Dreaming Mountain - will reveal sites that have played an important role in the history and culture of the local Yugambeh people. Traditional landowners tell Dreamtime stories about the creation of Jellurgal and the fishing, hunting and ecological practices of thousands of years of indigenous life. jellurgal.com.au

MAIN BEACH TO THE SPIT Federation Walk Coastal Reserve is set on 93 hectares of coastal dunes on the Gold Coast Spit, a unique fusion of native vegetation, dunes, open space and ocean views. The 3.5km Federation Walk starts in the car park opposite the entrance to Sea World and leads all the way to the Gold Coast Seaway, where there's a lookout over the spectacular coastline. Birders, prepare for a paradise of parrots, pelicans, bee-eaters, waders and kites.

O NORTH TAMBORINE Set in 12 hectares of magical rainforest on Mount Tamborine, this self-guided walk takes you past the crystal clear rockpools of Cedar Creek. The hike is a leisurely 1.5km, comprising forest floor trails, high-tech steel bridges through the upper canopy, and a 40m cantilever bridge that soars 30m above the creek and rainforest below. Look out for the endangered Richmond Birdwing Butterfly, one of Australia's largest butterflies. And don't forget (or drop!) your camera. rainforestskywalk.com.au

RACK CITY VINTAGE

Nestled in the back room of a 1930s house, Rack City is a fusion of vintage western, rock 'n' roll, gypsy spirit and a whole lot of soul. Find men's, women's and kids' clothes as well as cute collectibles dotted through the store.

This place has been around for as long as I can remember, and is run by the serious no-nonsense but always fun Greg Pead. Bursting with curiosities and rare finds, it will appeal to anyone who has a flare for individual style from the 1940s to the 1970s.

Six op shops in a row! Make a morning of it and meander through one after the other. These gems are full to the brim with pre-loved clothes, and you're supporting good causes as you shop. Just the other day. I picked up a three-piece 1980s ensemble that I teamed with a cloche hat and pearls, and hey presto, I had a killer 1930s picnic outfit.

Luxury brands your thing? Pacific Fair in Broadbeach is the Gold Coast's most stylish shopping destination, offering a huge collection of leading Aussie retailers alongside iconic global brands - think Givenchy, Hermes and Tiffany & Co. All the boutiques are set among tropical gardens complete with waterfalls and hanging chairs. Lush. pacificfair.com.au

It could be the back streets of Bangkok or Barcelona, but this bustling market is a short stroll from the Gold Coast Highway in Miami. Browse the indoor/outdoor stalls to the sounds of live music, and watch the markets come alive after 5pm under twinkling fairy lights. With furniture, fashion, art, jewellery, street food and drinks, it's a great place to meet local artists, and support small businesses. miamimarketta.com

O BIGGERA WATERS

A bustling hub of alfresco shopping, dining and entertainment, you can easily enjoy a full day here, wandering the multitude of enticing stores. After spending it up on a spree, check out the restaurants at Harbour Town Eats, including 8 Street, an Asian market-style alleyway overflowing with dumplings, spring rolls and fragrant curries. Locals also love Crafty's Sports Bar for burgers, fried chicken and cold beers. End the day on a high with a trip to the movies, just a few steps away. harbourtowngoldcoast.com.au

O CARRARA

If you want a side of face painting or pony rides with your retail therapy, head to Carrara Markets on any given weekend. Billed as the largest permanent marketplace in Queensland, it's been welcoming shoppers for more than 30 years, and with more than 400 stalls one visit probably won't be enough. Fashion, jewellery, souvenirs and art - it's a great place to find last-minute gifts for the people who've been feeding your cat. carraramarkets.com.au

Adventure

SKYPOINT CLIMB © SURFERS PARADISE

At 270m, SkyPoint Climb in Surfers Paradise is Australia's highest external building climb. If you have a head for heights, the opportunity to climb up the iconic Q1 Resort building – on the outside – should be on your Gold Coast holiday wishlist. Luckily, you get to take the lift up to the 77th floor and climb the last 30m to the top. It goes without saying, the views are pretty nice from up there.

© TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN

Fly high above the treetops (and conquer that fear of heights!) on a zipline tour at Tamborine Mountain. There are seven extreme ziplines that take you whizzing along at speeds of up to 70km an hour, 70m above some of the oldest rainforest in Australia. If you can keep your eyes open for the ride, it's a pretty awesome way to see the stunning Gold Coast Hinterland. No prior experience necessary. treetopchallenge.com.au

THUNDERBIRD PARK

© TAMBORINE MOUNTAIN

What kid doesn't want to unearth a 200million-year-old mystery? Thundereggs look like hard mud balls that have intricate centres of agate, chalcedony, guartz, opal and other crystal forms. They are found in ancient lava beds across the world, including right here on Tamborine Mountain. Budding archaeologists can dig for the 'eggs' when they visit, and cut them open to reveal, well, that's the surprise. thunderbirdpark.com

SEAWAY KAYAKING TOURS O BIGGERA WATERS

Getting in a kayak is a great way to discover the hidden treasures of the Gold Coast, such as South Stradbroke and Wave Break Island. Paddle through crystalclear waters, then pull up your kayak and spend time snorkelling with stringrays or just relax in the shade. Tours also go to the majestic Hinze Dam in the hinterland, where you can paddle the calm, fresh waters surrounded by mountains. seawaykayakingtours.com.au

◎ GOLD COAST AIRPORT. BILINGA

All this awesome scenery makes the best excuse to take a helicopter trip over it. A halfhour scenic flight will take you over the sunkissed beaches from Tweed Heads to Surfers Paradise and out over the Cook Island aquatic reserve, home to dolphins, turtles and sharks. As you soar along the magnificent beaches, you can watch the surfers at Snapper Rocks before returning over the high-rise towers of Surfers Paradise, with Mount Warning and the lush green hinterland to the west. abcheli.com.au

O BUDDS BEACH

What SUP? You are! Spot dolphins playing, mosey past turtles and cuttlefish at Budds Beach in Surfers Paradise, and play I-Spy with the sub-tropical birdlife in the mangroves of Macintosh Island. If you've never tried stand-up paddleboarding before, then no worries - tours start with a mini lesson to make sure you have the knack. govertical.com.au

WALKIN' ON WATER © COOLANGATTA

Surf culture and the Gold Coast go hand in hand. The 16km stretch from Burleigh Heads to Snapper Rocks was declared a World Surfing Reserve a few years back, joining only eight other spots worldwide. At the southern end lies the pristine Greenmount Beach, providing ideal waves and the perfect backdrop for one of the most learner-friendly locations. Take a two-hour introductory lesson, or polish up your skills with some 'performance' tuition. walkinonwater.com

© SURFERS PARADISE Set throughout Evandale Parklands, the Sculpture Walk features 49 art pieces on a peninsula in the Nerang River. A meandering path takes viewers close to the artworks set in beautiful natural surrounds. It's a little oasis of creativity that provides a peaceful contrast to the bustling Gold Coast heart.





BEENI FIGH

Based on true events, Spirits of the Red Sand tells the powerful and emotive story of three Aboriginal brothers dealing with clashing cultures in the 19th century. It is brought to life at Beenleigh Historical Village via roving immersive theatre - expect to pick up and move from scene to scene and is followed by a three-course dinner. BURLEIGH PAVILION O BURLEIGH BEACH

Food with a view? Tick. Perch on a bar stool overlooking Burleigh's rolling surf and order from the menu of bar bites. Start with freshly shucked oysters, and order the kids some woodfired garlic bread while you consider your next move. At the northern end of the Pavilion is the full-service Tropic restaurant. where you can see the chefs at work in the open kitchen preparing ocean king prawns and rainbow trout.

O SPRINGBROOK

Nestled on the edge of World Heritagelisted rainforest, and right next to the stunning Purlingbrook Falls lookout, Dancing Waters is a postcard-cute café with a penchant for homegrown and local produce. O ISLE OF CAPRI

This canal-side restaurant offers modern Australian cuisine with a twist of traditional Italian. With incredible views out over the Nerang River, the vista takes in the glistening Q1 skyscraper and high-rises of Surfers Paradise, and the alfresco setting allows for amazing views from every table. Make the most of the waterfront locale with spectacular seafood; prawn and bug meat risotto with a pink champagne sauce should hit the spot.

O NORTH TAMBORINE

This hinterland bar and bistro puts sustainability in the spotlight, with meat from humanely raised animals, cheeses made from organic milk and most other ingredients locally grown. Sit in the light and airy dining room or choose to dine alfresco at a wine-barrel table and enjoy the green surrounds and chirping birds. Favourite dishes include the slow-roast pork belly with house-made aioli, and the 'Oink and Surf' pork belly with prawns or calamari. three-little-pigs.com.au

This welcoming restaurant has it all: a beachfront location; excellent food; and complimentary colouring packs with the kids' meals. The adults stay for the three enormous copper tanks that house the bar's preservative-free beer, and the kids hang out for the free ice-cream that comes with their meal. Sitting at the base of Tamborine Mountain, Fox and Hounds stakes its claim as Australia's only authentic English pub. A recent million-dollar fit-out matches the million-dollar views from this Marina Mirage restaurant - stunning by day and spectacular by night. Fresh local seafood is a mainstay of the à la carte menu that offers chargrilled Moreton Bay bugs, flash-fried buttermilk calamari and Atlantic salmon.
